Battered Women Long-Term Shelter Project

Ohio formed a committee for the purpose of assessing the need for, and the feasibility of, a long-term shelter for battered women in Lucas County.

The Committee met eight times between October 12, 1981 and April 30, 1982. The committee studied and reviewed available written materials on sheltering battered women and their children, gathered information about and visited two local shelters, and surveyed by phone two long-term shelters. Junior League members of the committees visited shelters in Ann Arbor, Michigan; Cincinnati, Ohio; and Marion, Ohio.

Toledo accounts for 75% of Lucas County's population. Figures show that in 1980 82% of all domestic disputes/domestic violence calls came from Toledo and Toledo accounted for 92% of all complaints by women in Lucas County. During the first six months of 1981, Toledo accounted for 86% of all calls and 93% of all complaints by women in Lucas County.

Lucas County has one short-term facility specifically for battered women, the YWCA Battered Women Shelter, located in the Toledo YWCA building. Beach House, Toledo, is also a shelter which accepts battered women, but is not used exculsively for victims of spouse abuse.

Only battered women and their children stay at the YWCA Shleter. During 1980, the shelter housed 324 battered women and 407 of their children. In 1981, 180 women and 240 children. Although the average stay is two weeks; thirty-seven of the total stayed over two weeks; of these theirty-seven two stayed over 50 days, 3 over 40 days, for 30 days and the rest (30) left somewhere between 20 and 30 days.

The battered women and their children need counseling and emotional support, they have a need for protection, housing, financial support and a chance to seek employment. Such issues and needs are extremely difficult to resolve during a two-week stay at a shelter. Some women may require several months to resolve their problem(s) and become capable of moving into a different more independent arrangement.

Eligibility of women coming to Bethany House:

- women having children
- must be actively working on personal goals established with themby counselor
- unable to find housing
- unable to return home, does not intend to return to the abusive situation
- Services intend to have a network work closely with Crisis Center at the YWCA also to have counselor from Social Services Inc. in Toledo Diocese counsel the women
- Security protected by appropriate precautions
- Location Proximate to public transportaion and other needed Community Services
- NCUSION; There s a need in the Toledo area to provide long-term shelter for abused women and their children.

A conservative estimate of the potential use of a long-term shelter service (based on 1981) YWCA erusus-sgekter data) is ten women and their children every three months.
